Dear Parents and Carers,

Following the tragic news story about a number of children who have sadly lost their lives after falling into a frozen lake, our colleagues at West Yorkshire Fire & Rescue have asked that we share the following resource with schools. The Todmorden Together group comprises of school staff, governors, parents, community workers, police and many other stakeholders from the wider Todmorden community. It is a platform for us to discuss our students' life experiences in the wider community and work together to make improvements and changes for our young people, and others. On Wednesday this week, Year 7 students were treated to an online discussion with AM Dassu, the author of 'Boy, Everywhere'. The book tells the story of Sami, a young boy who is forced to flee Syria with his family when war breaks out. Sami's experience is one of both danger and discovery as he arrives in Britain following a traumatic journey over perilous waters. Our Year 7 students have been gripped by the book and they were given the opportunity to ask questions about life in Syria and the inspiration behind the story.





Last night was our Christmas show 'Rockin' Around the Toddy Tree'. Students performed wonderfully putting on musical and dramatic performances for all visitors to enjoy. I was so proud of all the students who performed, and we were even treated to some staff performances as well with a small collective performing a Christmas carol for us as a choir quartet. The atmosphere was brilliant and everyone really seemed to enjoy the show, well done to everyone who took part and huge thanks to Miss Brockman and Mrs Patchett-Byrne who always work so hard to make these events wonderful for all.

To allow for all students to show respect for our uniform policy we do carry a store of spare uniform in school. We do lend items out to students to support them in making the right choices and adhering to our school rules and values. During the course of this term, many items borrowed by students have not been returned. I would like to congratulate all our KS4 students who showed ambition by making the most of an opportunity and applying to participate in the once in a lifetime opportunity of travelling to Eswatini on a cultural exchange programme. The quality of applications was excellent, shortlisting was a challenging process, but 18 students were interviewed for the 10 places on programme last Thursday. Governors were incredibly impressed by the quality and maturity of student answers, hearing stories and learning about how the artefact they brought to interview would be of benefit. The ten successful students are delighted to have been selected for the visit and are excited to travel to Eswatini next summer. It is important for those who just missed out at each stage to continue to apply for opportunities when they are presented. Hopefully, we will be able to run these visits again next year.

On Tuesday our students had their Christmas lunch. Students were offered a meat or vegan option roast with all the trimmings and pudding too. Our students really enjoyed the dinner and it was a lovely way to get into the festive spirit in school with staff and students sitting down to eat and celebrate together.

From the week commencing 9<sup>th</sup> January we will be encouraging students to sit down and eat with a proper plate and a knife and fork in our dining facilities. New tables and additional seating will be provided for this purpose. We will also be phasing out any covid restrictions that we had in place. Wednesdays will become a roast dinner day, with no other options served. Children will not be allowed to take food outside to eat unless it is a packed lunch that they have brought from home on a Wednesday. This is something that we will be looking to implement full time moving forward, so that students are sitting down to eat every day in school.

Have a lovely Christmas and New Year with your families and friends. Students return to school for a slightly shorter first week in the New Year on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> January due to Monday being a bank holiday and Tuesday a training day for our staff.
