Dear Parents and Carers,

I want to start by issuing a huge thanks to parents for your support over the arrangements for strike days, student uniform and ARCH values and for working with us to ensure that students at Todmorden High School have a great school experience. I run my virtual forum at regular intervals throughout the year so feel free to drop in and I will happily listen to feedback and queries around school life. Thank you so much for supporting our students in bringing their daily equipment. As you will know, this allows them to access their learning with ease. As we have a few students currently missing elements of their essential equipment in school, please do remind yourself of the items required by consulting the poster attached. By bringing all their equipment, and wearing their uniform correctly, students are rewarded with five Class Chart points every day, and these can go a long way to securing prizes and rewards within our student body. Last night we had a fantastic Raising Aspirations Revision Event for our Year 10 students. We had good attendance and those who attended got to visit revision specific sessions with our teaching staff where they learned techniques and skills to help them revise as they move towards Year 11. Students were also able to visit a number of careers stalls in our canteen area and speak to careers advisors and college providers about pathways for the future. Thanks to all who attended, I hope you found the event useful.

Next week is our final ARCH Day of the year. On these days, students can develop wider learning in a whole host of fields such as citizenship, diversity, child on child abuse, health and wellbeing, relationships, finance and careers, much of which is statutory content. All the sessions are designed to offer students the chance to properly discuss and debate the issues raised and to develop their understanding of these challenging real-life issues.

The GCSE examination period begins in earnest on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> May and finishes on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> June (with a contingency day planned on 28<sup>th</sup> June). I'm sure you will not need reminding but please take time to talk with your child about the importance of these exams for our Year 11 students and how they can contribute to supporting the older students in school, particularly by changing in silence for PE lessons and being quiet when moving past the hall







and the gym. Even though they have been working extremely hard, our Year 11 students are likely to be anxious about their exams and I'm sure they would value the support of the whole school community. Good luck in your exams to those students in Year 11, we know your hard work will be worth it.

In addition to the GCSE examinations, Year 10 will have a series of exams, some of which do count towards their final grade, and some of which are mock exams. Students in Years 7 to 9 will continue to have assessments that will inform us how

much progress they have made. Please do encourage your child to show ambition to unlock their unique potential by preparing thoroughly for these assessments. Completing homework and revision is very important to prepare effectively, materials will be provided by your child's class teacher through Class Charts. Please do see the school website for further information to support with revision, that all students can use to prepare for end of year assessments, student and parent guide to revision (todhigh.co.uk).
