

#### Year 11 Mock Exams



After the Christmas break, Year 11 will begin a full series of mock examinations. These will run from the 15th - 26th January. Mock examination timetables will be given to students in due course. Please encourage your child to complete revision for these examinations. They are an important part of preparation for the summer exam series and help teachers to predict grades for college applications.

Students all have access to GCSE Pod, Carousel, SPARX and the revision area of the school website which can be found here https://www.todhigh.co.uk/learning-and-teaching/revision-by-subject/ as well as work set by their teachers to help guide them through the revision process.

Can I also please take a moment to place emphasis on the importance of following the examination rules during these mock exams. Students need to ensure they have the correct equipment and no electronic of mobile devices on them during the exam. These should be switched off and in bags. Again, this is in preparation for the full exam series and important in building good habits. We wish all students the best of luck in these examinations.



Targeted academic sessions for KS4

At the start of this academic year we adjusted the way we select and support students for what we have previously called 'intervention' or 'revision' sessions after school. Our targeted academic sessions means we are using the information from students' assessments and specifically planning a series of sessions that are intended to close a knowledge gap for the students selected or support them in practising a skill that is key to the examination specification.

These sessions are intended to support **our school vision of unlocking the unique potential of every student**. We are aware that some students see these sessions as a negative thing, however being invited to one of these groups will not necessarily mean that the student is not doing well in that subject, rather that we believe that they could, with a short, tailored period of intervention, do even better. The selections for the groups are made by our curriculum leaders based on assessment information. The sessions run in a period 6 slot that shows on the student's timetable. If your child is invited to one of these sessions you will receive a class charts notification and a letter explaining the subject and reason they have been selected. The letter will also ask you to confirm your child's attendance so we and you know where they are at these times.

There are some sessions where we have additional places beyond the students we are identifying. If you would like your child to attend these sessions we are now running an opt-in process. In the first instance please let the class teacher for the subject you would like to opt in to know that this is the case and they will follow our in school system for this.

We are also aware that getting home after the sessions is a barrier for some students. If this is the case please let us know as we may be able to help support your child getting home.


