


Enabling individuals to unlock their unique potential

Some of our super ambitious students took part in the Y9 Forensic Science Day yesterday. This is the second time Mr Jon Bates from 'Sci High' has been to Todmorden High School. Once again, sharing his vast knowledge and experience, he engaged students through a series of realistic activities and role play. Students learnt not only about the science which underpins the evidence given in court, but the importance of planning how to work and sticking to that plan. This echoes the work we do in school to develop self-regulated learners.

The links made to the curriculum were superb, and included;

- kinetic energy in the role of blood spatter
- the role of evolution in developing fingerprints and other vestigial organs
- how the U.K. is a world leader in biometric science because the U.K. developed the science first
- microwaves used in mobile phones and how once phones are entered into evidence signals are blocked by Faraday cage bags





The students worked brilliantly together as a team to collect and analyse footprint samples, fingerprints, DNA traces and blood spatters to gather enough evidence to reach a valid conclusion. Students then staged a full Crown Court trial, illustrating the roles of all the professionals involved, it was like a scene from Happy Valley! Students and supporting staff had an entertaining day of learning. We hope many of them are encouraged by this to choose separate science and take their learning further.

In the light of the cost and living crisis, during our ARCH Day 2-2-23, some children will study sessions on life skills relating to budgeting, saving energy and money and generally being wise with money. The sessions will be delivered by the Citizens' Advice Bureau and Calderdale Council (supervised by school staff). At 3pm there will be an open session for parents, carers, friends, relatives, staff – anyone who feels they would benefit. Topics covered will be bills, grants and debt management (more details to follow). There will also be a signpost to information on how to access the services should you need. School will provide a free light, warm meal for all attendees so it would be most helpful if you could let reception (01706813558, admin@todhigh.co.uk) know that you are coming before the event.

Once again this event is open to all, you don't need to have a child at school to attend.

This week Year 11 EPR students had a visit from Bob Kibble who is a Humanist celebrant. Bob spoke on what it means to live life as a Humanist as well as giving Humanist responses to different philosophical and ethical issues. There was time for questioning and relating content to real life situations as well as gathering information for the EPR exam. Thanks to Mr Womack and Ms Wells for organising this for our students.
