An important message from Healthy Futures Calderdale regarding electronic cigarettes below for parents' attention please:

We have been made aware that young people locally have had serious reactions to the inhaling of vapours from vapes that have had fruit flavoured nicotine e-liquid substituted for fake "THC" or "cannabis oil" vapes which could contain a dangerous chemical, vitamin E acetate, which can produce toxic gas. The police are aware and are following up the dealing of such products. It's important that we find out exactly what these vapes contain, and also



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that we understand whether they are US-standard products, or UK-standard products that have been adulterated. We recognise that some young people do and will vape, but want them to be aware that harmful products are circulating and how to be vigilant to any serious health problems caused by vapes. Please share with students in your school the following message:

Potentially dangerous vapes are currently in circulation in Calderdale which do not meet UK quality and safety regulations. There is no way of knowing if a vape liquid contains incredibly harmful chemicals, so advice is to not use illegally sold vape liquid or pens, particularly those sold as "THC" or "cannabis oil". If you have used a THC vape pen or THC vape liquid, monitor yourself for symptoms including a cough, shortness of breath, chest pain and promptly seek medical attention if you have concerns about your health using 111 Online or dialling 999 in an emergency.

Please share this information with your child to ensure that they are fully aware of the dangers presented by vaping and e-cigarettes.
