School information

Strike action - I sent a strike action letter out to all parents yesterday detailing the school's plan for the upcoming strike days in July (5th and 7th). Just to reiterate that message I am sorry to inform you that Todmorden High School will be closed to all students in Year 7-10 on those two days, barring some exceptions. If the NEU give more guidelines after this letter and before the strike, we will contact you. The full letter is published in the letters home section of our school website and has been sent out on Class Charts.

The school day - As you will be aware we have been consulting on our school day in order to ensure that we are fully compliant with Government guidelines around school opening hours, to better meet the needs of our students and to respond to feedback. The consultation on the school day went to staff, parents and students and a working party was formed internally to support with its development. Following the consultation, the school day, from September, will now be 8:30am on site and 3:00pm finish. We will publish the school day plan shortly on our website and I will share it in my letter. Thanks to all who offered advice and ideas.

Year 9 Learning Manager - As of Monday next week Miss James is taking over the pastoral care of our Year 9 students who she will be taking forward into Year 10 and the beginning of their GCSE journey. Mrs Kontogiannopoulou will be focussing her efforts on our upcoming Year 6 students, who she will be looking after when they join us in September as the Year 7 Learning Manager. If your child is in Year 9 and you require pastoral support or would like to speak to a member of staff in school please contact Miss James on <u>j.james@todhigh.co.uk</u> from Monday 26th June.

Uniform - The temperature is due to drop next week therefore we expect all students to attend school in their full uniform with blazers, top buttons done up and ties worn proudly. We will continue to monitor the weather and if we get another spike in temperature we will respond appropriately. Please continue to send your child in to school with a water bottle so that they can access our water fountains throughout the day.

School rebuilding programme - On 29 June 2020, the Prime Minister announced that the government would establish a 10-year school rebuilding programme. The school rebuilding programme (SRP) will undertake major rebuilding and refurbishment projects, with investment targeted at school and sixth-form college buildings in the worst condition across England. If you are not already aware we have been selected as one of those schools and will be having a new building at some point within the 10-year plan. I have attended some meetings around the process



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and informal discussion has now begun within the Leadership Team and the wider school community about what our dream school might look like. I will keep you all informed as the process continues and if you have any ideas or want to have any input please don't hesitate to get in touch. Other information

Important message from Calderdale Public Health and West Yorkshire Fire & Rescue

We have been made aware of an incident where a small number of children have become unwell after playing, swimming or paddling in local rivers and canals.

At this time of year, we respond to many concerns about young people swimming and jumping into open water.

Be aware! Open waters are exposed to the elements and may therefore contain bacteria/viruses from natural sources such as animal waste. This can make you extremely unwell.

Please tell your children to:

- 1. Avoid drinking water from open water sources
- 2. Wash hands thoroughly after playing in or near rivers, lakes, streams and canals

If your child becomes unwell after contact with open water, seek medical advice as appropriate.

Please also remind your children about the other hidden dangers of open water. There are many dangers when entering canals, rivers, and reservoirs, which have tragically taken lives. **The number of accidental drownings in our region is on the rise.** Even with all the hot weather we have been having the water temperature will be cold. Below 15°C is defined as cold water and can seriously affect your breathing and movement

If you get into difficulty in the water #FloatToLive:

- 1. **Take a minute** The initial effects of cold-water pass in the less than a minute so don't try and swim straight away
- 2. Relax and float on your back to catch your breath. Try to get hold of something that will help you float

3. Keep calm - then call for help or swim to safety if you're able

If you see someone in difficulty in the water call 999 and ask for FIRE!
