How to use this powerpoint

- Ask students to consider each scenario – try to really dig deep and get them to think hard... use each scenario for a detailed conversation with your tutees. This will help build your relationship with each of them and with them as a group. They may have stories or examples to share of when they were in similar situations – these can be really insightful.
- Discuss how each links with our school ARCH values. What would a person with ambition do? How do we show respect in this situation? Who do we need to show care towards in this situation? What's the most honest course of action, which shows integrity?
- Do we always do what we know we SHOULD do? Why? Why not? What might get in the way of us doing the right thing?
- What are the consequences of not acting in the right way? Now? A week later? A month later? A year later?

Rules for discussions

- One person talks at any time, either your teacher or one student
- Your teacher will tell you whether they want hands up or they will be targeting individuals
- We all listen to each other respectfully, and we listen to the whole point a person is making rather than butting in/ interrupting
- If we disagree, we do so politely, using phrases such as, 'I'm not sure that's always true' rather than, 'that's a load of rubbish' – remember, we can agree to disagree – if we all thought exactly the same life would be very dull
- Listening is an active role – you need to engage ears and brain, and give your mouth a rest UNTIL you are invited to speak

What's integrity?

- the quality of being honest and having strong moral principles.
- This means that you are not just honest, but are honest in the right way, behaving well towards all others, and yourself. A person with integrity knows how to behave so that outcomes are the best for everyone. For example, you might be being honest when you tell a friend you don't like their new haircut, but you're not acting with integrity as your words are hurtful and so are the wrong way to behave







You have a group of friends that you hang out with and you've always really enjoyed their company. However, recently they've started doing things that you don't want to – like nicking things from the corner shop and vaping.




