
Governments and Kings took no responsibility for public health. It was left largely to

Public Health

the local governments to make laws and intervene. It used to be thought that medieval towns were filthy, without drains, sewers or rubbish collections. Some of this was true as it was a struggle to keep town clean. However, modern historians have found out that:

- Parliament passed the first law requiring people to keep the streets and rivers clean in 1388.
 - Medieval people washed and exercised. Many towns had bath houses Towns paid 'gong farmers' to clear out human waste from cesspits
- Many towns had quarantine laws, boarded up the houses of plague victims, and isolated people with leprosy in lazar houses.
 - Monasteries had running water and good toilet facilities
- Hospitals were built e.g. St Bartholomew's in London in 1123.
