Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly, a special mention to two Year 7 boys - Adam Goddard and Laurie Williams, who have both been selected for the Rossendale U13 Cricket District following three weeks of trials. They will go ahead and play throughout the summer holidays across the region representing Rossendale. They'll be playing against the Rochdale U13 side, so that should make for interesting watching, following my news in last week's letter.

We remain very proud of the way the vast majority of our students wear our uniform; they really do exemplify our ARCH values. As we enter, hopefully, a period of more settled warm weather, we would like to remind you that students can opt to wear smart tailored black shorts instead of full-length trousers, if they wish. We will revert to the usual two uniform choices of tailored trousers or knee length skirt in September. We would also like to remind all students about our policy on jewellery and make up. Only a single pair of studs and a wristwatch are allowed. Other items of jewellery, if seen, will be challenged and persistent offenders might find themselves facing a sanction for this. Likewise, we do not allow excessive make up, false nails or nail varnish; students should expect to be challenged and may face sanctions if these are worn to school. Finally, students may well be given the option to remove blazers once they have arrived in classrooms, but the blazer must always be worn to arrive to class. The optional layer is the jumper; the blazer is an essential item, required every day in school. Many thanks for your continued support of our high expectations for your children.

On the topic of uniform, we would love to take any donations of used uniform for our school uniform shop. Please bring any shirts, skirts, trousers, blazers or ties into reception and we will gladly take these. We use our uniform shop to provide uniform for students who have lost an item, who need to change their uniform or who have failed to come in the correct uniform to school. Any donations very welcome.

Over the next few weeks, we are undoubtedly going to experience some warm weather. Whilst all students will be expected to arrive to school, and their lessons, in their blazers – we will be allowing and encouraging students to remove their blazers once in the classroom to allow them to manage in the heat. Please do keep sending your child into school wearing their full uniform including their blazer. It would also be advisable for students to ensure they bring a water bottle with them into school to keep hydrated, we have water fountains in the canteen that students can use during their break and lunch time.

Year 10 are currently undertaking a series of mock exams in preparation for Year 11. There will be an opportunity for any students who miss an exam to sit them at a later date in the term.
